











AAU Faculty Demographics Comparisons





Faculty of Color at Public AAUs











Non-Tenure Faculty



Tenure-Related Faculty by Rank



Appendix

Data Sources

The employee data used in the report is extracted from Banner during the second week of October by the Office of Institutional Research. An employee's information is based on their "primary" position at the time of the extract from Banner. The comparison to the Association of American Universities is based on data submitted to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) as part of their Human Resources collection. For the purposes of the comparisons, only public institutions are used. The Oregon demographic data is provided by the U.S. Census Bureau.

Definitions

Faculty Counts

There are a small number of tenure-related faculty who work outside of the schools and colleges. The overall university counts include these individuals. In addition, there are a small number instructors who hold indefinite tenure and the counts broken out by rank exclude these faculty members.

Tenure-related

Tenure-related faculty are those who have indefinite tenure or are in tenure-track positions. Faculty who have relinquished tenure and have moved into a retired position are not counted as tenure-related. Similarly, tenure-related faculty who currently hold an administrative position are not included in the tenure-related counts.

Race and Ethnicity

Faculty of color include Asian, Black, Hispanic, Native American, Pacific Islander, and Multi-Ethnic (or Two or More Races). Beginning in Fall 2011, a change in federal requirements in how race and ethnicity are collected make comparisons over time problematic. The new methodology may artificially increase the number of faculty identified as Hispanic. The reporting group Asian and Pacific Islander was disaggregated into two groups: Asian and Native Hawaiian / Pacifica Islander. The category Two or More Races reflect the counts for individuals selecting more than one race category rather than the category Multi Ethnic. Because the University of Oregon has not resurveyed its employees using the updated federal guidelines, only new employees are subject to the new format. International faculty are those who have a citizenship attribute of nonresident alien or substantial presence.
